CSA REPORTS

Financial Report: Ms. Visnevskaja presented the report.

Placement Report: Ms. Visnevskaja reported on the placement changes in each category.

LONG RANGE PLANNING UPDATES:

Mental Health Collaborative was attended by Mr. Jack Ledden. Youth for Tomorrow came to talk to the Collaborative about opening an office in Warrenton which is scheduled to be in operation June 2019.

Mental Health Collaborative was presented with “Hidden in Plain Sight” an initiative through the Sheriff’s Dept to educate parents about a variety of adolescent problems and the paraphernalia that often indicates a child is struggling.

The Youth and Family Initiative for Health Community meeting was attended by Ms. Erika Visnevskaja & Mr. Frank Finn. Local partners sponsored a vape/juul workshop in December and another is scheduled for this month. Feedback from the first workshop was phenomenal, so another has been planned to include youth from all area high schools.

Mr. Finn advised community partners and schools are preparing to administer the PRIDE survey during fall 2019. Mr. Finn is working with school administrations to have the survey issued to 6th grade students in addition to 7-12 as in years past. Local practice has been to administer the survey every 5 years, but given the many community changes since 2016 it was determined to complete it one year early.

Ms. Visnevskaja advised Verdun has created 2 programs of interest to CPMT, a 12 week truancy program and a 16 week at-risk youth program. Both programs focus at building student's strength and resilience as well as looking for the underlying concerns causing the problematic behavior.

ANNUAL SERVICE GAP SURVEY

CPMT discussed the survey. Individual members will discuss with their teams and forward survey responses to Ms. Visnevskaja to compile by March 29.

PRIVATE DAY COST STUDY AND REIMBURSEMENTS UPDATE

Study continues and there are no new updates.

FY18 CSA OUTCOMES REPORT

CPMT discussed FY18 outcomes report, noting trends and what each trend might indicate.

CHAIR TIME

Chair advised on positive progress with the substance abuse program at the jail. PATH Foundation and CSB purchased a building in Warrenton to house the CSB Fauquier Clinic. The county is working with the Town of Warrenton to zone the old building for a potential residential facility. Board of Supervisors will adopt the budget next week.
