HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

According to the US Environmental Protection Agency website, “Leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable, or reactive ingredients are considered to be household hazardous waste (HHW). Products such as paints, cleaners, oils, pesticides, etc. that contain potentially hazardous ingredients require special care when you dispose of them.”

Fauquier County offers a residential HHW event at the **Corral Farm Facility on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of every month from 7am – 3pm**. This event allows Fauquier County residents to dispose of HHW material in a safe manner with a licensed contractor. Please note HHW quantities are limited to 15 gallons (liquid) or 40 pounds (solid) per day. Liquids should be in containers no larger than 5 gallons each.

Items NOT Accepted


- Ammunition
- Biological Waste
- Explosives
- Radioactive materials

HHW Recommendations:

- Keep products in their original containers. Label materials that are not in their original containers. Make sure lids are tightly sealed.
- Do not mix products.
- Secure products upright in a cardboard box so that they do not tip over in transport.
- Ensure adequate ventilation if products are transported inside a vehicle.
- Keep flammables out of direct sunlight and away from sources of heat, spark, flame or ignition.

FLUORESCENT BULBS

Residential quantities of fluorescent bulbs and tubes (and ballasts) are accepted at the **Corral Farm facility only**. These mercury containing items are considered universal (hazardous) waste with specific handling requirements in large quantities. These items can be brought to the Corral Farm facility any day of the week from 7am-3pm.
