During the month of June, you will notice more construction and the scale house replacement at Corral Farm collection site. You will notice a new concrete pad has been poured for the recycle containers and the recyclers have all been moved to their new location. The construction crew is working on the foundation for the new permanent transfer station and the scale house was demolished at the end of May. Our staff is working out of a temporary scale house until the new building is complete.

They are collected at Corral Farm for Local Boy Scout Troop 92 to ensure a proper and honorable disposal, and to teach younger scouts how to respect our nation's flag. Special disposal includes treating each flag with dignity and respect. Local scouts conduct flag burning ceremonies and then bury the ashes. Nylon flags are cut apart and recycled with textiles.
