Green Back to School Tips



Back to school season is here, and with it are new opportunities to reduce, reuse, and recycle.

Reduce: When buying school supplies, try to purchase items with little to no packaging, and look for notebooks, pens and other supplies with recycled content. Send lunch to school in reusable sandwich bags, lunch containers, and drink bottles.

Reuse: Consider reusing items from last year that are in good condition such as binders, backpacks, pencils, and crayons. Encourage children to bring home food scraps for backyard composting, or compost at school (if this is available.)

Recycle: As you unpack items like shoes, crayons or even dorm supplies, be sure to recycle cardboard boxes, and paper or plastic packing material. Styrofoam can be brought to the Corral Farm Public Collection Site, and dropped off with any site attendant.

Recycle Right: Textiles



Fauquier County Environmental Services accepts many kinds of textiles for recycling, at the Corral Farm Public Collection Site and the Remote Collection Sites. Accepted textiles are: Purses, belts, paired shoes, clothing, blankets, sheets, towels, and curtains. **Items must be clean and dry.**

Rugs and items containing stuffing **are not** accepted (i.e. pillows, stuffed animals, comforters or down/poly-filled winter coats.)

Marshall Paper Recycling Upgrade

The Marshall Remote Collection Site will soon be getting an upgrade to mixed paper recycling. A new mixed paper compactor will be installed and ready to accept materials in mid-September. This compactor is similar to the current plastic and cans compactor at the Marshall Site. Compacting the paper will allow for less frequent hauling to and from the Corral Farm Recycling Center, which will save money for the County and taxpayers. Please follow the same guidelines as regular mixed paper collection. No plastic, metal, or cardboard, no dirty or food-contaminated paper, and please keep paper dry.
