Major Charlie Bopp retires after distinguished law enforcement career to Fauquier County



Major Charles Bopp retired from the Fauquier County Sheriff's Office on Monday, August 31, after serving the people of Fauquier County for the past 16 years. His distinguished law enforcement career began as a patrol officer in Harrisburg, PA. He later moved to federal service as a special agent with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and transferred to the United States Secret Service. He retired as a Special Agent in Charge, before joining the Fauquier County Sheriff's Office in 2004.

Major Bopp witnessed significant changes in law enforcement over the course of his career. He maintained a strong passion for law enforcement and believed in promoting solid and ongoing training in all aspects of his profession.

Major Bopp served the Fauquier Sheriff's Office as a detective and as Commander of the Patrol Division, and finally as Commander of Operations.

Major Bopp has been an instrumental component in the agency, insuring the safety of Fauquier County citizens. He will be remembered for his dedication and leadership, as well as for his service to the Shop-With-Cop program.
