TIRES

Utility tires under 18" outside diameter FREE

Passenger Vehicles; car, pickup, trailer \$3

Large Vehicle; tractor trailer, split rim \$12

Oversized Tires; farm equipment, loader \$75

Facility does not accept tires from scraper pans, Ukes or vehicles of this size.

MATTRESSES & BOX SPRINGS

\$5 (per mattress or box spring)

VEGETATIVE WASTE (BRUSH, STUMPS)

1 Ton Pickup/smaller vehicle **OR** single axle trailer load \$5

1 Ton Pickup/smaller vehicle **AND** single axle trailer load \$10

Larger Vehicles and multi-axle trailers—by weight across scales \$60/ton

Bagged Leaves, chips FREE

*bags must be separated and emptied

FREON

\$10 for each item containing Freon.

Door off \$10

COLLECTION PROGRAMS AT CORRAL FARM

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

Products such as paints, household cleaners, battery acid, garden products, insect spray cans, gasoline, rodent control products, flammable caulks & adhesives, lacquers, mineral spirits, and pet supplies are collected the **1st & 3rd Saturday of the month from 7am—3pm** (and by appointment on Wednesdays). The products are collected at the Corral Farm Collection Site only. The HHW program is for **RESIDENTS ONLY (no farms)**. Businesses wishing to dispose of hazardous waste should contact the office for references. **Quantities limited to 40 lbs (solid) or 15 gallons (liquid) per day. Liquids should be in containers no larger than 5 gallons each.**

SHARPS (NEEDLES) COLLECTION

FOR RESIDENTS ONLY—Needle sticks are an ongoing hazard for staff. In an effort to contain sharps and protect employees, a collection program has been started at the residential sites. To properly dispose of needles, please put in a heavy plastic container, such as a laundry detergent bottle, and secure the lid with duct tape. Label the bottle “HOME SHARPS” to alert employees. Each collection site has a specific location to drop off sharps. Please ask the attendant for assistance. Keeping sharps out of the waste stream is a major step in protecting staff who are sorting materials or working on machinery and unknowingly come across needles.

SECOND GENERATION

The Corral Farm Collection Site offers a service to reuse items called “Second Generation”. This area is for the deposit of slightly used goods such as furniture, bicycles, toys, infant items, etc. to be given to non-profit organizations for the support of needy families. Items not accepted include appliances, electronics, bedding mattresses, tires, food, clothes, lawn equipment, paint, and hazardous materials.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

Electronics can be recycled at the Corral Farm Collection Site Monday through Saturday. (Items cannot be accepted on Sunday.) Some electronics have disposal fees. Please see the fee schedule (on back) for details.

PREPARATION OF RECYCLABLES

NEWSPAPER

Stack loose for more efficient processing. No plastic strapping, bags, etc. Inserts put with mixed paper.

MIXED PAPER

Place paper items such as office paper, flattened packaged food boxes, magazines, junk mail and newspaper inserts in mixed paper container. No plastic bags, strapping, etc. No pizza boxes.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

Ribbed cardboard should be flattened. No pizza boxes. No string ties, tape, etc.

GLASS

Rinse bottles and other glass food containers and recycle metal lids and rings as small metal recycling.

PLASTIC

Rinse bottles and jars, commingled with aluminum/ steel cans. Retail plastic bags must be clean, empty and dry, collected separately.

TEXTILES & LEATHER GOODS

Bring clean & dry clothes, drapes, blankets, paired shoes, belts, purses, towels, sheets, etc. Ripped or stained clothing acceptable. No pillows or comforters.

ALUMINUM/METAL

Rinse cans and other food containers, commingled with plastic bottles and cans.

SCRAP METAL of All Types

For **LAWNMOWERS & ITEMS WITH ENGINES** Remove battery, antifreeze and fuel. Drain oil and remove plug.

HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES

Includes rechargeable batteries. Tape each contact end.
