## FIRST RECYCLING COMPACTOR AT MARSHALL RESIDENTIAL COLLECTION SITE

Back in 2012, you may remember the Department of Environmental Services pilot program using a self-contained compactor to collect certain recyclable materials at the Corral Farm collection site. It was determined that when using the self-contained compactor versus a regular collection container, the weights of recycled materials upon hauling increased 4-5 times the weights of the loose materials. These weight increases mean less hauling trips and cost to the county.

Because of the successful test at Corral Farm, the Department of Environmental Services has now installed the first self-contained compactor for #1 and #2 plastic, aluminum and steel can recyclables at the Marshall Residential Collection Site. Located in the northern part of Fauquier County, the Marshall Collection Site is on Route 55, east of Marshall, and is the busiest remote Residential Collection Site in the county.

## TRANSFER STATION EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015

As of July 1, 2015 the Fauquier County Department of Environmental Services will begin transferring all Municipal Solid Waste to another landfill outside of Fauquier County. **Residents will continue to bring their household trash and recyclables to the collection sites as they do today.** Construction of a new transfer facility is planned to begin at the Corral Farm site in early 2016. The benefits of the transfer operation will be the subject of the next Wasteline Newsletter.

### *County Employee Participation*

During Earth Day week in April, the Fauquier County Adult Court Services Department picked up about 4 tons of trash and recycling along county roads. On Friday, April 24, fifteen additional county employees assisted by cleaning up roads around the Ritchie-Rogues-Old Mill intersection in southeastern Fauquier. These employees collected 104 bags of trash, 21 tires and other miscellaneous items such as televisions and mattresses.
